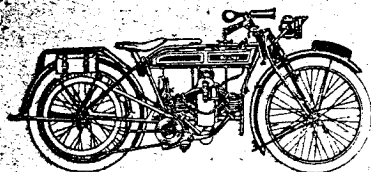

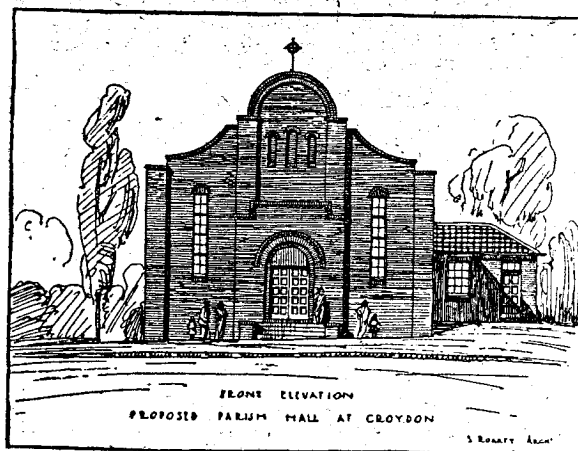

DESCRIPTION OF THE NEW CHURCH

The new church will be built of brick: The dimensions are as follow:—Height, 43 feet, length 97 feet, width 40 feet.

The church will be well ventilated, and have plenty of light. We have looked to these two things more than to anything else.

The seating accommodation will be 400; but 600 will easily fit in it. The sanctuary will be more roomy than in most churches, giving our building a noble appearance.

Three exits are provided—one on either side and another—the main one—on Webb St. The first steps to dig the foundations will be taken next week. The architect is Mr. Roarty, A.R.I.B.A., and the contractor Mr. John Kennedy, of Ashfield.
