

VICTIM OF COOMA ROAD SMASH UNIDENTIFIED

Late last night Canberra Police had been unable to identify a Sydney man killed when a car rolled over on the Monaro Highway yesterday.

The accident happened about half a mile on the Canberra side of the N.S.W.-A.C.T. border.

The driver of the car was Mr. John Frederick Monk, 33, debt collector, of New Canterbury Road, Petersham, Sydney.

Mr. Monk was taken to Canberra Community Hospital by ambulance, but was discharged after treatment.

The name of an 18 to 20-year-old girl critically injured in the accident was not been released.

Mr. Monk told police he knew the dead man, a Scotsman aged about 23, only as Jock.

The priests were Father John Thomas Masters, 30, of Holy Innocents Church, Croydon, Sydney, and Father Alfred Bruce Heaps, 35, of St. Joseph's Church, Rosehill, Sydney.

Mr. Peter Buchanan of Campbell, was admitted to Berrima District Hospital on Saturday night after his motor cycle was involved in

a collision with a car.

The accident occurred at the intersection of the Hume Highway and the Sutton Forest Road, near Moss
